This study abroad course, offered through Metro State University, provides an opportunity to study the




History of Japanese Popular Culture while spending 18 days in beautiful Japan. During your stay in Tokyo and Tateyama (Chiba), you will participate in many learning activities, field trips, and experiences related to Japanese culture, Japanese history, military/WWII history, Eastern/world religions, global issues, and of course, Japanese pop culture: literature, arts, film, anime, manga, music, fashion, and games. You'll participate in community service projects as well. Pre-departure sessions occur in Spring 2024 with travel May 14-31, 2024. Japanese language skill not required.

Course Information: HIST 372A History of Japanese Popular Culture (4 credits)

In this course, we will examine various aspects of Japanese popular culture. Critical analysis of different forms of cultural production, from the theoretical and thematic perspectives of class, gender, globalization, modernity, national/racial/ethnic identity, sexuality, invented traditions, and war memory, will provide insight into Japanese history, culture, and society.
