- 1. Listening: Understanding authentic speech and dialogue
- 2. Speaking: Describing, narrating, reacting, and analyzing spontaneously in the target language
- 3. Reading: Understanding the content of authentic texts and materials
- 4. Writing: Writing compositions which develop narrative, descriptive, and analytical skills
- 5. Culture: Acquiring cultural information through the use of authentic materials and texts for the purpose of understanding and appreciating the way of life and the contributions of other cultures
