


How to Search Within a Specific Journal

First let's go to the library home page. From any Normandale web page, scroll to the bottom and click "Library."



On the Library page, click the "Journal Title Search" tab of the Search Our Resources box.

Type in the name of the journal, magazine, or newspaper you would like to find and hit search.



On the results page for that journal, look at the View Online section. This is a list of the databases that have access to that journal. The “available from” dates show the range of publication dates each database has access to for that journal.



Let's scroll down the list and pick Medical Database (ProQuest), since it has the widest date range. Click on the Medical Database (ProQuest) box to go to that database.

If you use the search bar, the database will show you results for the words you searched but only from articles published within that specific journal. In the example below, notice in the search bar it now has your keyword, plus a PUBID that tells the database to just search this journal.
